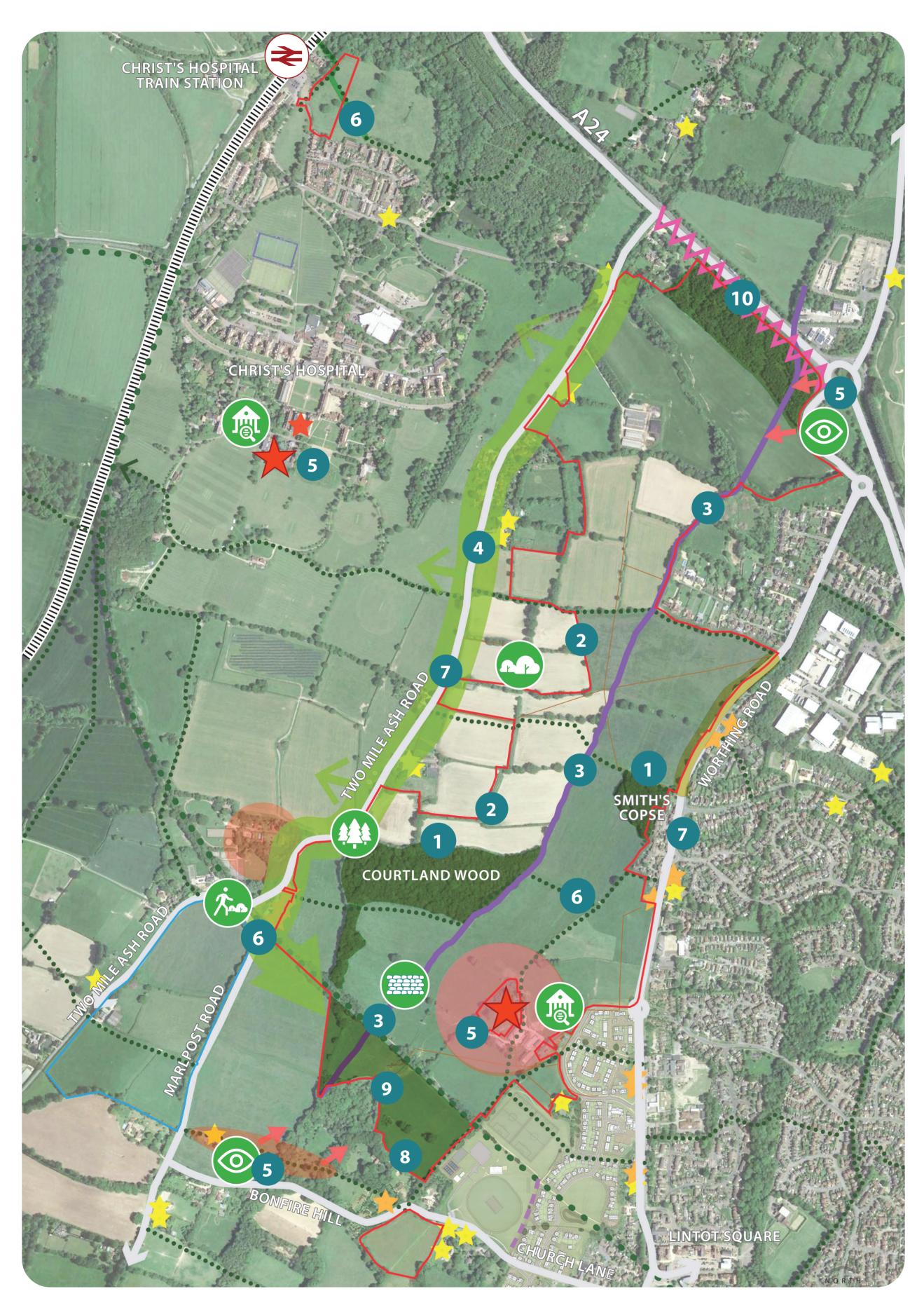




Existing Features



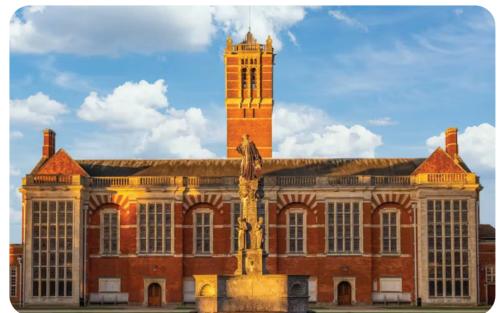
The key landscape features and constraints shown below have shaped our initial proposals. Each has been carefully considered to create a masterplan that sits sensitively within its surroundings, enhances the landscape and strengthens local connections.



- 1 Existing Woodlands:
 Protect and enhance Courtland Wood and
 Smith's Copse.
- 2 Important Hedgerows:
 Protect and enhance the existing hedgerows.
- Existing Archaeological Features:
 Protect and enhance the historic boundary
 where possible.
- Green Western Edge:
 Protect and enhance the open landscape to the west, preserving rural views and the setting of listed buildings within a strong green character.
- Protect Views and Setting:
 Safeguard key views towards Christ's
 Hospital Tower, Great House Farmhouse and
 surrounding listed buildings.
- Public Rights of Way (PRoW), Bridleways and Downs Link: Enhance existing walking, cycling and bridleway routes to improve access and connectivity.
- Provide strong connections to Two Mile Ash Road and Worthing Road.
- Existing Mature Trees:
 Protect and integrate existing mature trees as part of the landscape-led framework.
- Sensitive Southern Edge:
 Maintain an open, rural character south of
 Great House Farmhouse and along the Downs
 Link.
- A24:
 Mitigate noise and visual impact from the A24 and Hop Oast roundabout through planting and landscape buffers.

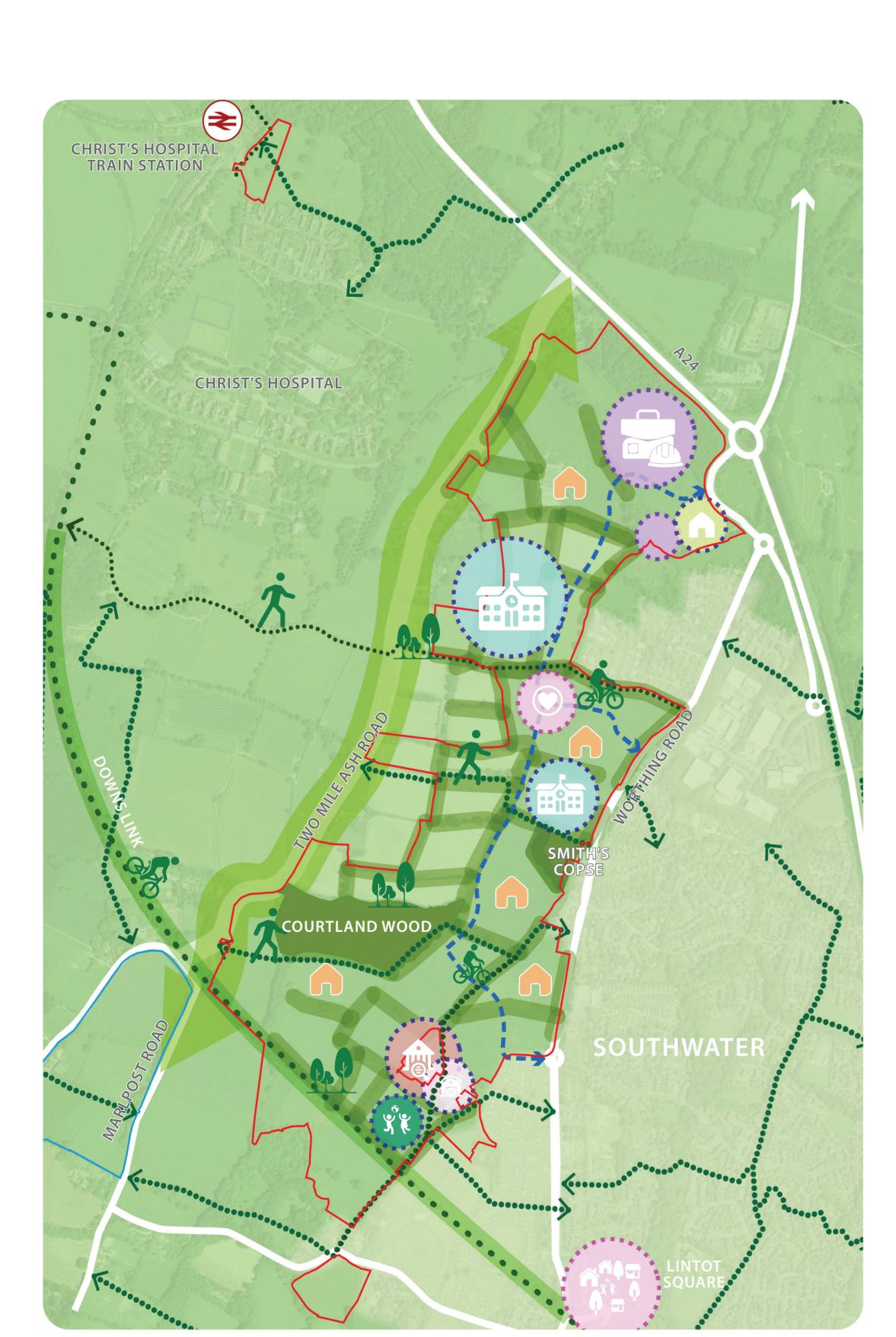

New Schools & Community Facilities: A new primary, secondary and nursery school, alongside community uses within the new neighbourhood centre and near Great House Farmhouse.



A Landscape Led Approach: A place shaped by its landscape - protecting ancient woodlands, mature trees, hedgerows and the rural character that make this site unique.



A Sensitive Approach to Heritage Assets:
Protecting and enhancing the setting and views of key heritage features, including Great House Farmhouse, Christ's Hospital Tower and surrounding listed buildings.



New Homes: An opportunity to deliver a mix of high-quality new homes of varied tenures, for all age groups, set within a distinctive green landscape.



Promote Walking & Cycling: A redesigned layout that prioritises safe, connected routes for walking, cycling and public transport, with improvements to Worthing Road and surrounding streets.



Protect & Enhance Ecology: Protecting mature trees and hedgerows - creating enhanced habitats to support nature.



New Play & Sport Facilities for all ages: A variety of inclusive play spaces set within nature, together with new sports pitches, offering recreation and play opportunities for all ages.



Employment Opportunities: Up to 4 hectares of new employment land providing space for small and growing businesses.

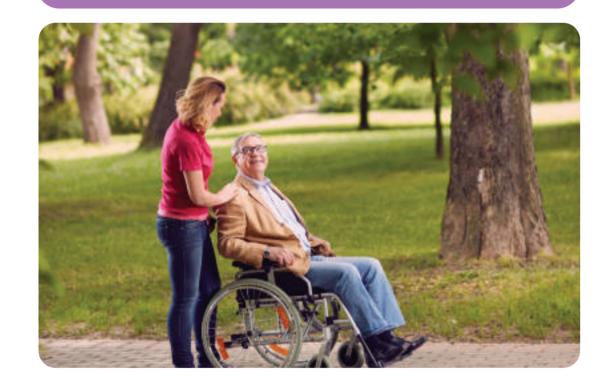

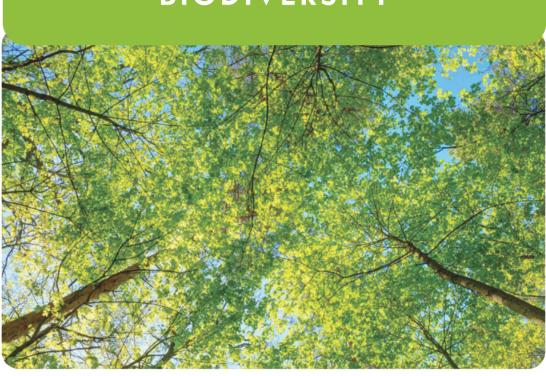

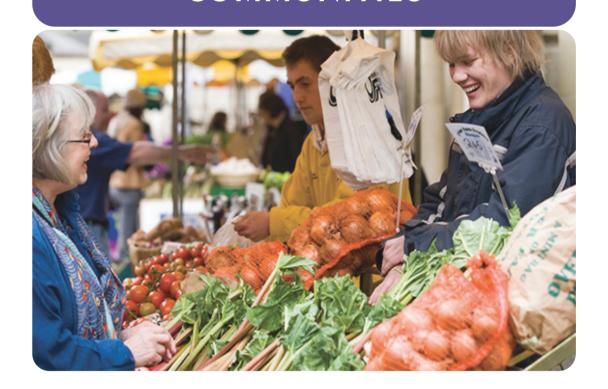

KEY PRIORITIES



Landscape-led and heritage-led design: Celebrating Southwater's setting, from woodlands and hedgerows to Great House Farmhouse.



Strong connections: Linked by the Downs Link and walking/cycling routes to Southwater, Horsham, and the countryside.



Balanced community life: Homes, schools, community spaces, and jobs creating a vibrant neighbourhood.



Diverse housing choice: A mix of homes for all ages including for older residents, families and key workers.



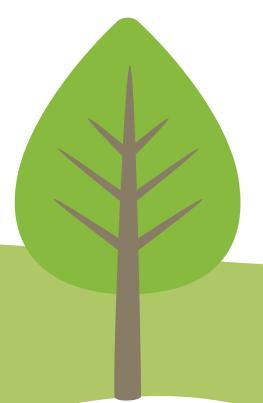
Green infrastructure and biodiversity: Nature corridors throughout the neighbourhood, providing access to green open space.



Sustainability: Design that supports healthy living and builds climate resilience.



Supporting Southwater: A small neighbourhood centre that complements and strengthens Southwater's existing facilities at Lintot Square.

NEW HOMES

Up to 1,000 new high quality homes are proposed. This includes 450 homes allocated in the Southwater Neighbourhood Plan.



EDUCATION

A new primary, secondary and nursery school.



EMPLOYMENT

Up to 4 hectares of employment land enabling new job opportunities.



NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE

A community hub which could have a range of small-scale retail and community facilities. This would be secondary to Lintot Square.



PUBLIC OPEN SPACE

- Safe play facilities and spaces for children of all ages
- Parks and gardens
 Natural and semi-natural spaces such as parklands and woodlands
 A walking trail of approximately 5km providing opportunities for
- exercise
- Outdoor gym and places to exercise in nature



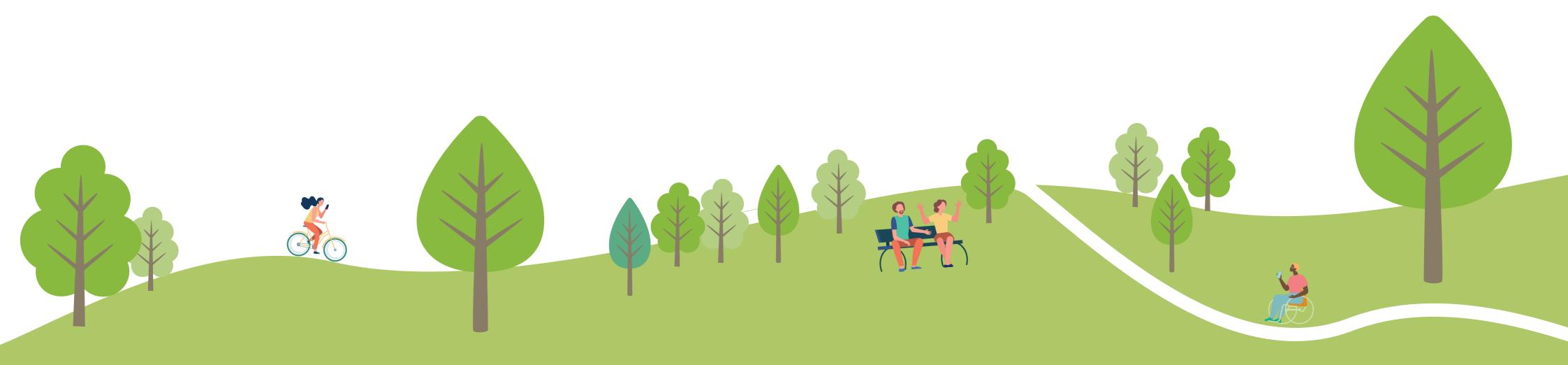

Masterplan Evolution



A summary of the key feedback received since 2022 and how the updated 2025 masterplan responds to it.



PLANNING POLICY

Respond to the requirements of both the **Southwater Neighbourhood** Plan (SNP2) and the draft Horsham Local Plan (HA3).



A new framework that aligns and responds to adopted and emerging local policies, balanced housing mix and accessibility requirements.



HERITAGE & ARCHAEOLOGY

Protect important heritage assets of the site, such as the medieval setting of Great House Farmhouse, the green character, hedgerows and woodlands.



Reduced development and generous green buffers to protect historic landscape features and the setting of **Great House Farmhouse.**



MOVEMENT

Improve walking, cycling, pedestrian crossings and public transport connections. Protect the character of the area and enhance public rights of way.



New walking, cycling and bus connections, with safer crossings and direct links to Worthing Road, Two Mile Ash Road and the wider area. A connected network of green streets designed to prioritise pedestrians and cyclists.



LANDSCAPE

Protecting the green landscape character, retaining existing hedgerows, mature trees and enhancing the rural feel of the site's western edge.



Nature leads the design, generous green buffers, woodlands and hedgerows link together to create a living landscape woven through every part of the neighbourhood.



CONSERVING & ENHANCING NATURE

Protecting wildlife habitats and managing drainage naturally and sustainably.



A living landscape that protects and connects existing habitats, woodlands and wildlife, delivering measurable biodiversity net gain and

sustainable drainage.



DESIGN

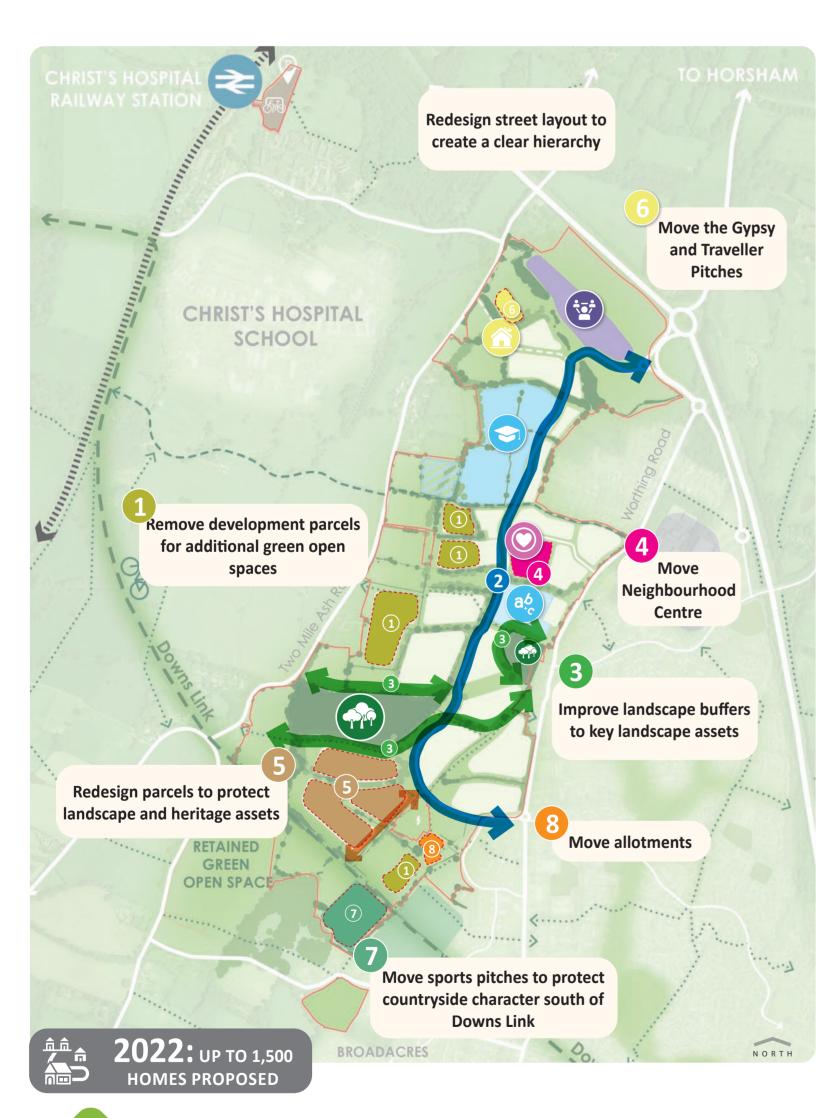
Create a more sensitive layout shaped by the landscape and local character, protecting key views and heritage settings, with lower building heights and densities.

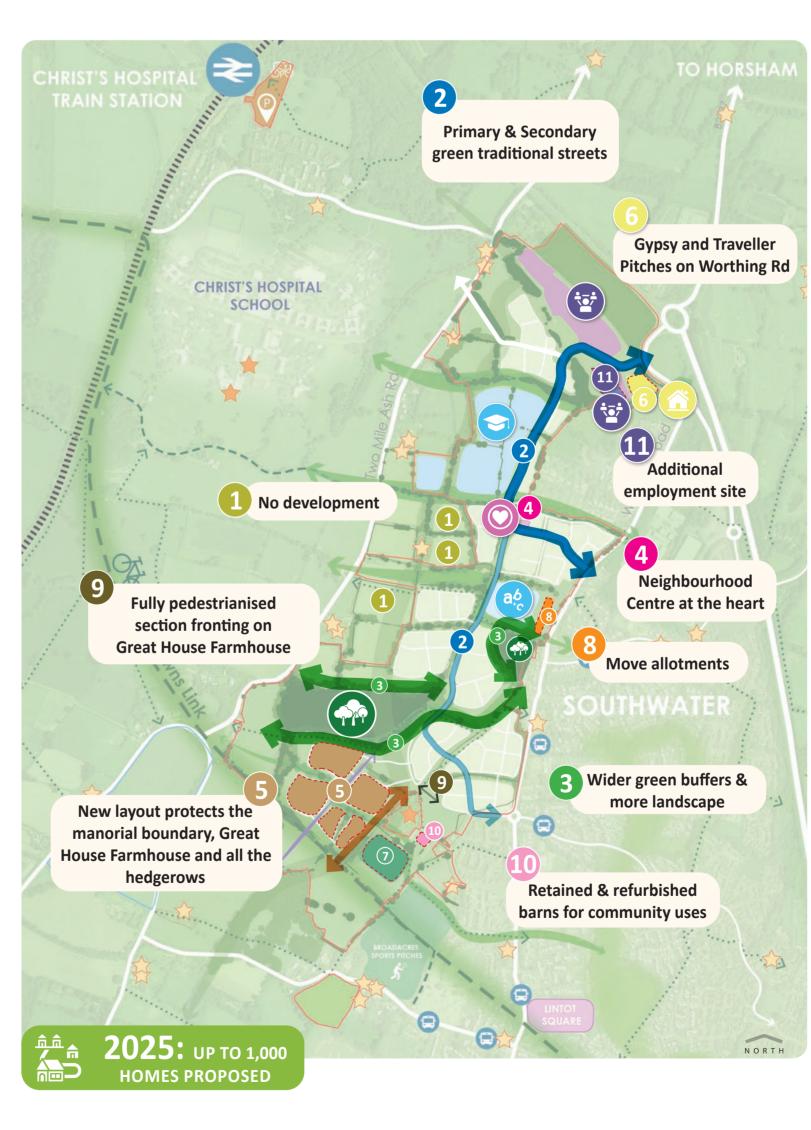


A connected neighbourhood shaped by the landscape. The masterplan includes new schools, local employment space and a neighbourhood centre that complements Lintot Square.

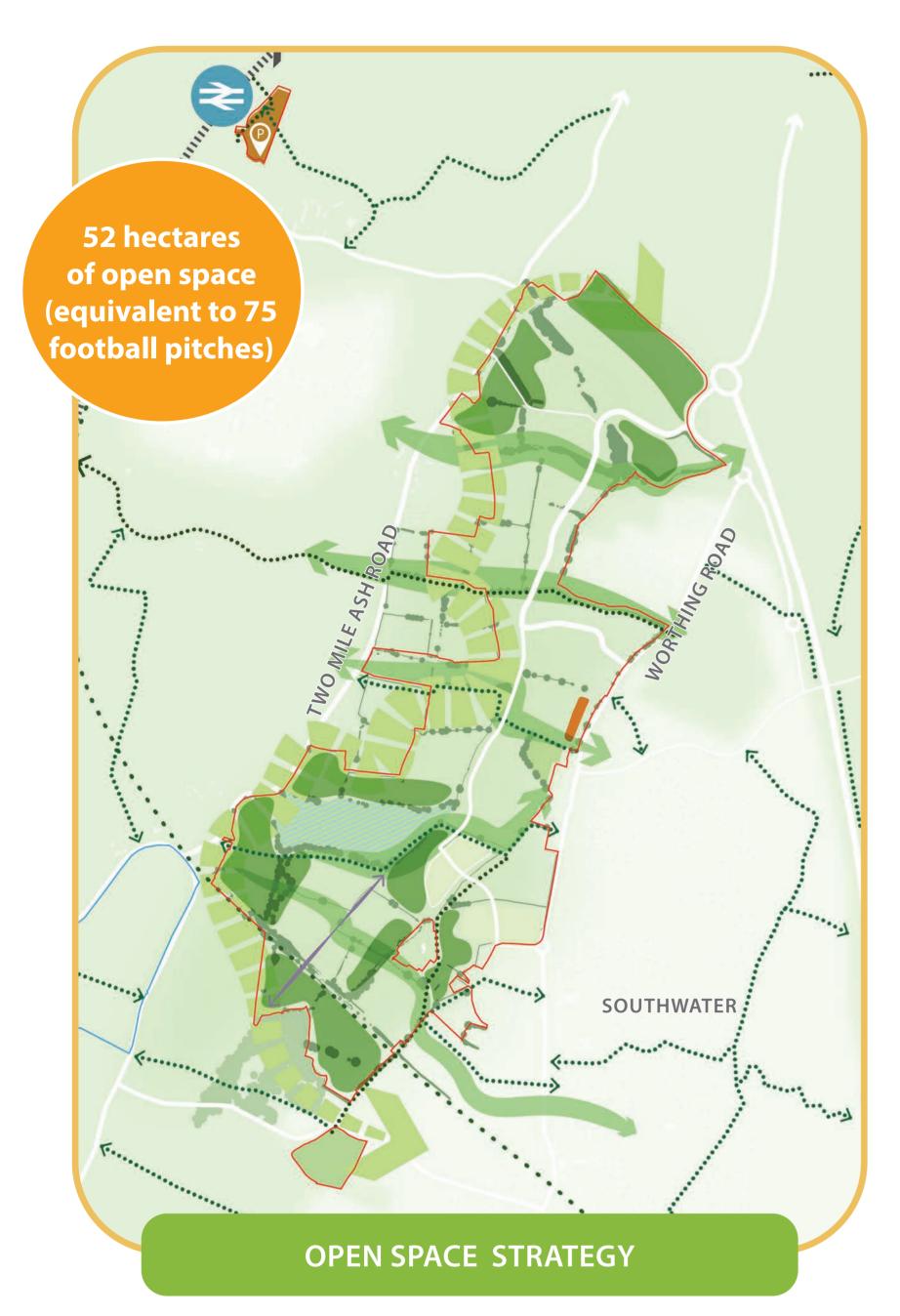




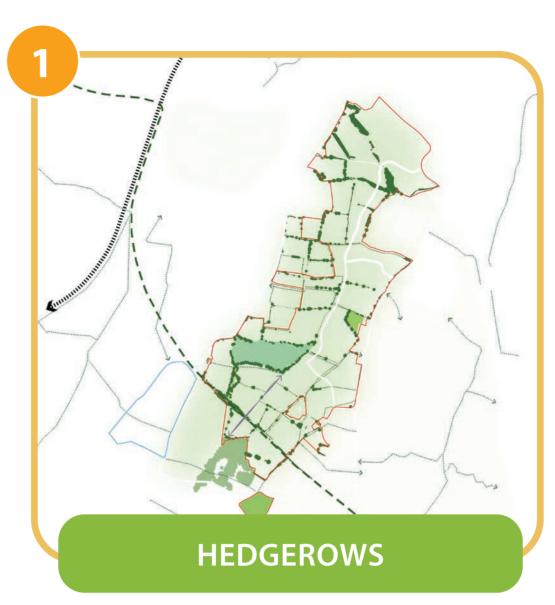
Landscape-led Approach



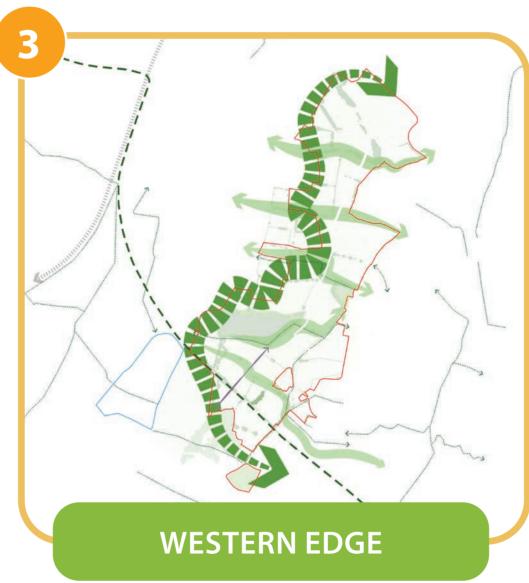
The masterplan is shaped by Southwater's rich and distinctive landscape. It builds on existing natural features, enhancing green assets, strengthening habitats, and creating new connections to celebrate the area's unique character and sense of place.



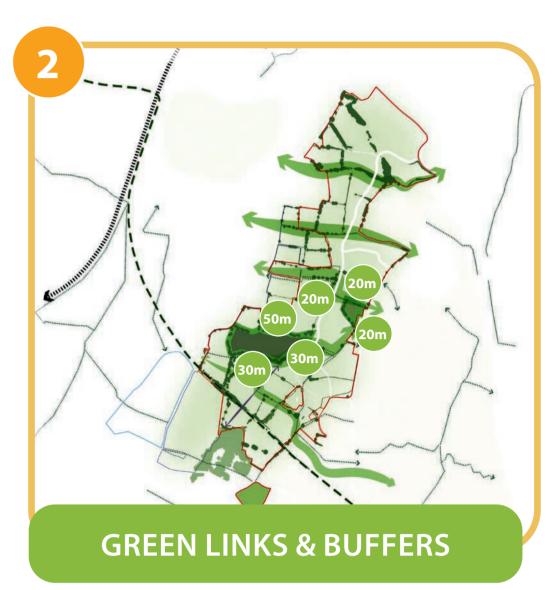
A landscape-led masterplan with over 50 hectares of green open space - creating a living landscape where everyone can live close to nature. Woodlands, meadows and community greens are all linked by safe walking and cycling routes.



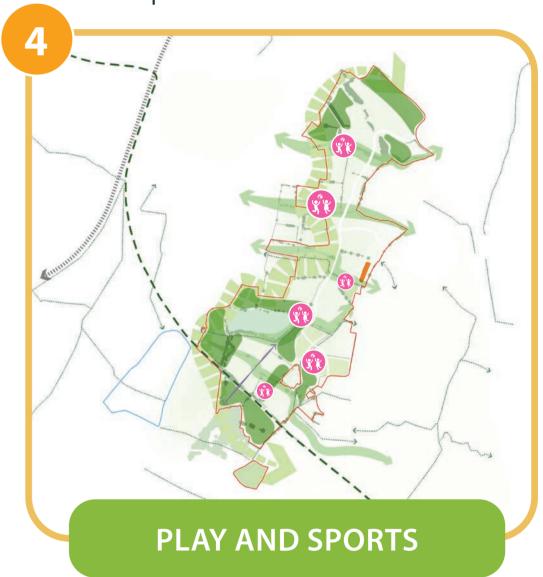
Over 95% of the historic hedgerows are protected and enhanced, giving Southwater its rural character. These green corridors connect habitats, support wildlife and help define new neighbourhoods.



A sensitive rural edge retains views to the open countryside and reinforces the site's green character. Low-density homes and planting create a soft transition to the wider landscape.



Wider green buffers and connected corridors protect trees, woodland and habitats while managing water naturally. They provide space for wildlife, recreation and sustainable travel across the masterplan.



New green play spaces and sports pitches for all ages sit within the landscape, with shared community use of school facilities providing year-round opportunities for activity and wellbeing.

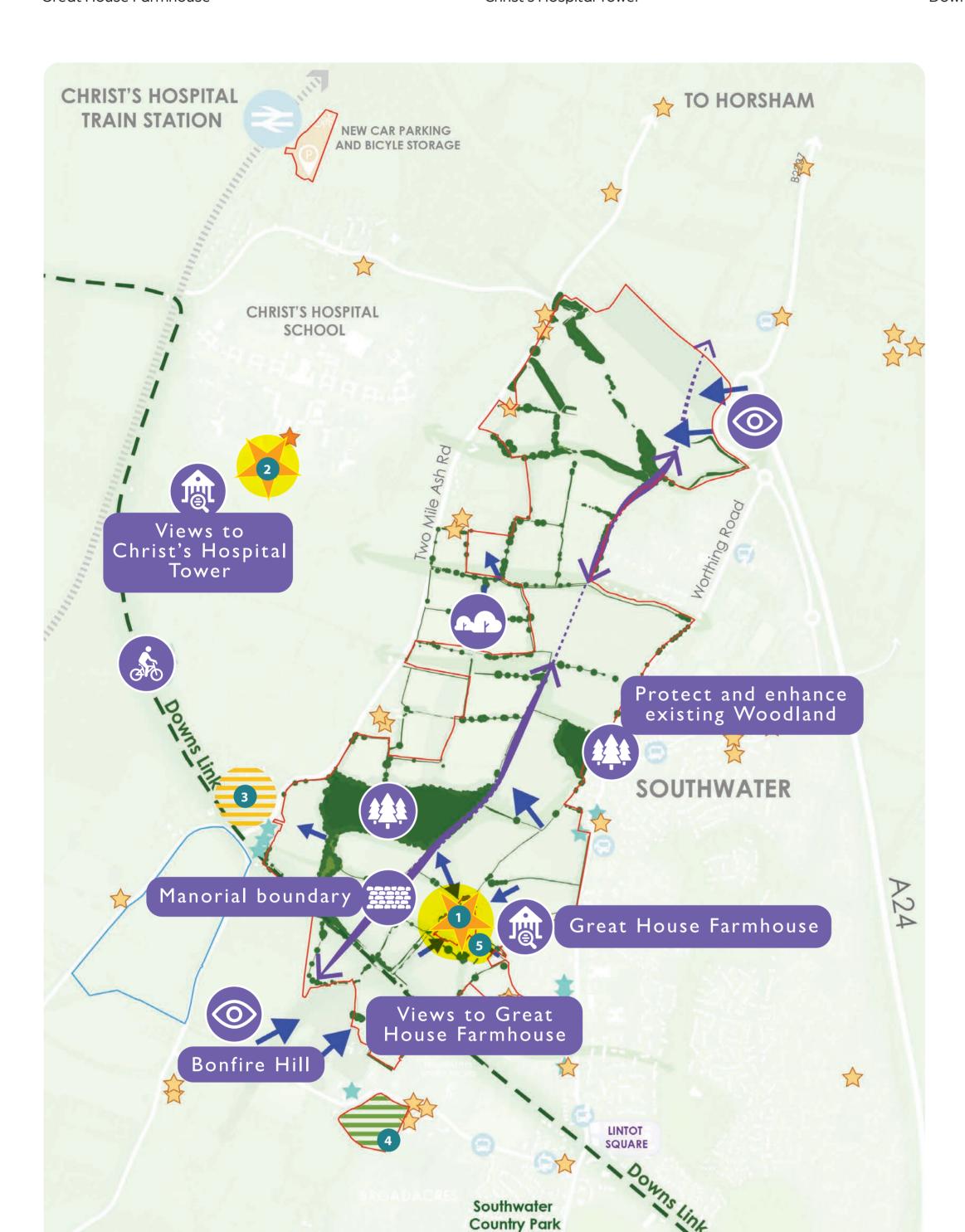

Key views

Protect views to Christ's Hospital Tower, Great House Farmhouse, listed buildings and green western edge.

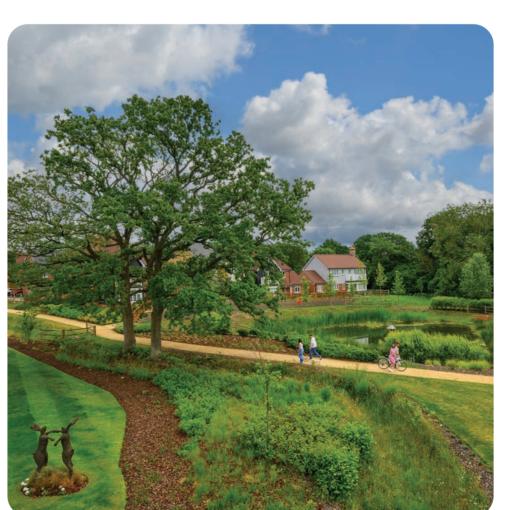

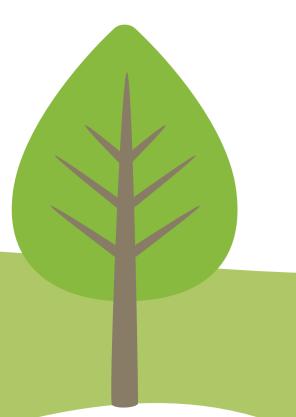

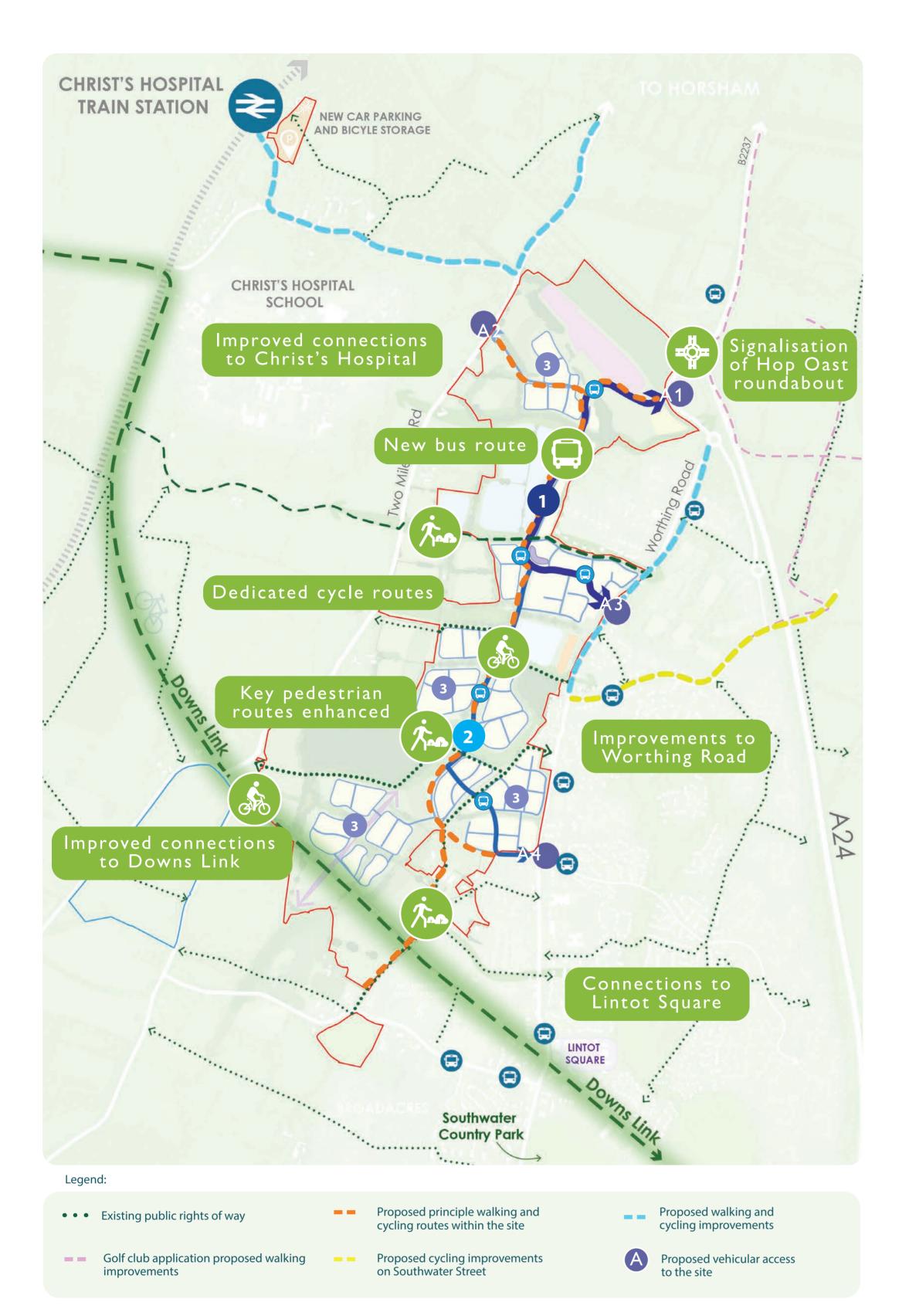






Movement





A connected, sustainable place.

Connecting homes, schools, and green spaces through safe walking, cycling, and bus routes. The plan opposite shows how the masterplan encourages sustainable travel, with safe, new and improved streets and routes connecting to the wider surrounding.

Primary Street

Connects the A24/Hop Oast roundabout to Worthing Road through the neighbourhood centre, providing access to the employment area, secondary school and new key local facilities.



Secondary Streets

Link the primary street with surrounding neighbourhoods, connecting to Two Mile Ash Road and the Broadacres roundabout. Designed with cycle lanes and potential for future bus services.



Tertiary Streets

Traditional, tree-lined residential lanes that create quieter neighbourhood streets within a green setting, providing access to new homes and reinforcing the rural character of the neighbourhood.



Walking & Cycling Routes

Public Rights of Way and bridleways are enhanced and extended to create a continuous network that prioritises walking and cycling. These routes provide wider connections to Christ's Hospital, Lintot Square and the surrounding countryside, linking new neighbourhoods seamlessly with the existing community.



Bus route

Bus services are proposed to loop through the new neighbourhood, connecting the new schools, neighbourhood centre and employment area to Southwater and Horsham.

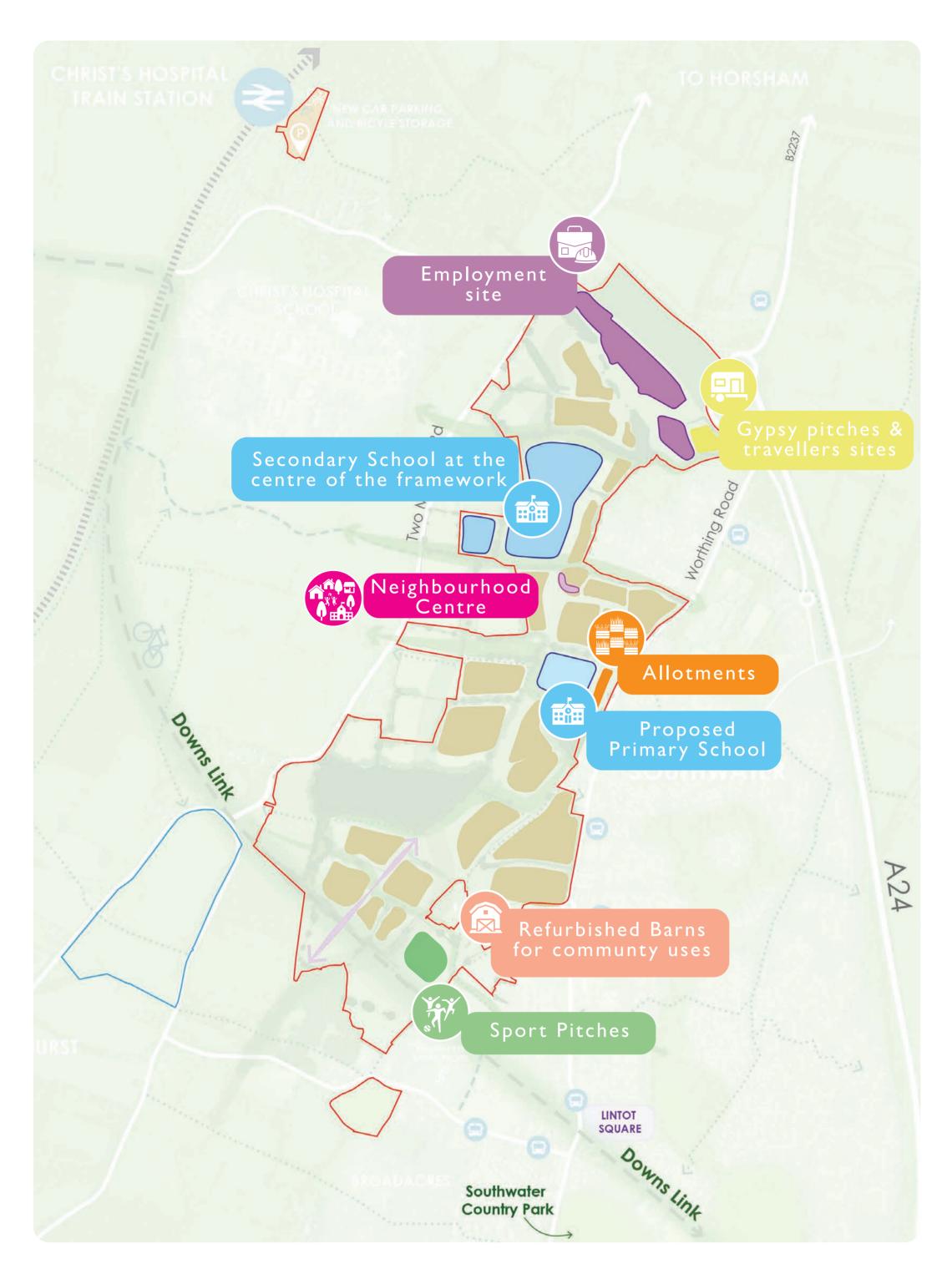






10 Community Infrastructure





A balanced and vibrant neighbourhood.

Creating a healthy, well-connected community with schools, community facilities, a neighbourhood centre, employment spaces, traveller pitches, and sports areas designed to serve both new and existing Southwater residents.



New Schools

Primary, secondary and nursery school for new and existing residents of Southwater.



Neighbourhood Centre

A small scale neighbourhood-focused centre that delivers key services, flexible retail and community uses for new and existing residents, complementing nearby Lintot Square.



Employment Site

Up to 4 hectares of employment land enabling new job opportunities.



Gypsy & Traveller Pitches

5 gypsy and traveller pitches in line with Horsham Local Plan requirement.



Play & Sport Pitches

A variety of new local and neighbourhood play spaces, playable landscapes, and sports facilities, including new football pitches and a cricket pitch.



Barns for Community Uses

The existing barn south of Great House Farmhouse to be retained and refurbished to accommodate community uses.

Up to 1,000 new homes of which 35% will be affordable, including 450 allocated in **Southwater Neighbourhood Plan.**



A mix of rented, shared ownership and discount market homes.



Housing for older people, families and key workers.

Sustainability Features



Fabric first approach in the construction of homes with high standards of insulation and glazing.



Use of low carbon technology such as air source heat pumps rather than gas boilers.



Energy efficient lighting and appliances.



EV charging facilities and secure cycle storage for every home.



Mix of amenities to reduce travel demand.



Provision of separate waste bins within kitchens to promote the segregation of waste.



Dedicated green routes for cycling and walking including improved public rights of way and road crossings.



Investment in local public transport services, including new bus stops.
